

**Complex & Developmental Assessment Services**

We provide a range of specific assessment services designed to understand a child’s skills in a variety of areas (e.g., intellectual, learning and achievement, attention, social-emotional, behavioural functioning)

Cost	Description
<b>\$1800</b>	<p><b>Complex</b> - We conduct complex assessments when there are multiple questions about a child or youth’s learning/development, as well as significant behavioural or emotional concerns. These assessments are intended to clarify your child’s strengths and difficulties, as well as help sort through multiple issues or diagnoses.</p> <p><b>Developmental</b> - Are you concerned about your child’s development in multiple areas, such as understanding others, expressing themselves, getting along with others, being independent at home and school, learning, and understanding ideas and concepts such as time, money, and safety rules? We provide developmental assessments that consider children’s overall development and intellectual functioning as well as their daily living skills. As part of this service, we conduct assessments or re-assessments of suspected or previously diagnosed intellectual disability, including “MID” (mild intellectual disability), “DD” (developmental disability), and “GDD” (global developmental delay).</p> <p>This fee level is typical for CYDC families who are financially secure and/or who may have full or partial comprehensive insurance/health coverage to help cover psychological service expenses.</p>
<p><b>Anything below \$1800 requires a Fee Adjustment Application to be completed and approved. This reduced fee level is reserved for CYDC families for whom the full fee would represent a significant financial hardship, and who may have limited or no insurance/health coverage to offset service fees.</b></p>

## Learning Assessment/Psychoeducational Services

Cost	Description
<b>\$1600</b>	<p>Does something seem to be getting in the way of your child being successful at school? Are you concerned about your child or teen’s reading, writing, math, or learning skills and work habits? Do you want to understand your child or teen’s “learning profile”? We conduct psychoeducational assessments that look specifically at children’s learning. These often include intellectual assessment, academic assessment (reading, writing, and math), questionnaires, observations, and contact with your child’s school. As well, we may look at your child’s language development. These assessments may lead to a diagnosis such as a learning disability (which could include dyslexia, dyscalculia, dysgraphia, and executive functioning difficulties), language disorder, and/or ADHD. The results from these assessments can be used to help inform an Individual Education Plan (IEP) for your child.</p> <p>This fee level is typical for CYDC families who are financially secure and/or who may have full or partial comprehensive insurance/health coverage to help cover psychological service expenses.</p>

## Screening & Specific Assessment Services

Cost	Description
<b>\$500</b>	<p><b>Cognitive and Academic screening assessments</b> - Our summer cognitive and academic screening program offers brief assessment for younger children (age 5-7) to better understand their learning profile, including reading and math skills, cognitive processes important for learning, and processing skills that support reading and mathematics development. These assessments provide a “snapshot” of where a child is at, and may lead to recommendations to help at school and home. No diagnoses are given.</p> <p><b>ADHD assessments</b> - Do you have concerns with your child or teen’s ability to focus, resist distractions, stick to boring or difficult tasks, stay organized and “put together”, and keep track of their belongings? Is your child or teen constantly moving, super talkative, or always jumping from one thing to another? Does your child or teen often “act without thinking”, have difficulty planning ahead, or not seem to learn from consequences? Do these kinds of struggles make life more stressful at home, school, and in the community? As part of this service, we use interviews, questionnaires, observations and record review to determine if your child might have ADHD. We can also look at ADHD as part of a learning assessment.</p> <p>This fee level is typical for CYDC families who are financially secure and/or who may have full or partial comprehensive insurance/health coverage to help cover psychological service expenses.</p>
